

Punctuality

Parents are reminded that all children are expected to be in every day at 8.00 am unless there is a valid reason for an authorized absence, parents must call the school office and inform reason of absence. A child cannot be late more than a maximum of three times in a term! If punctuality falls below this, a meeting with the headteacher will be arranged and every time a child is late, their name will be recorded.
