

## Managing suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases in Childcare and Educational Settings

**SUSPECTED** case in child or staff member

If the child is at school/nursery – **isolate** away from others until they can be picked up. Siblings should go home as well if at school/setting.

If a staff member – they should avoid all contact and **go home immediately**.

You do not need to send the 'bubble' of the child/staff home unless they live in the same household.

Ensure child/staff member isolates at home for 10 days from symptom onset and receives a test.

The rest of their household must isolate for 14 days and should only get tested if they develop symptoms themselves. This includes live-in siblings.

All children/staff who have been in contact with the symptomatic person, should wash their hands for 20 seconds. Contact points/surfaces they came into contact with should be thoroughly disinfected/cleaned.

Testing can be booked online at nhs.uk/coronavirus or by calling 119.

## **NEGATIVE**

Child/staff can return immediately once they are well enough.

Household contacts can stop self-isolating immediately

## **POSITIVE**

Follow the confirmed case process on the right and continue to self-isolate for 10 days from symptom onset.

<u>CONFIRMED</u> case in child or staff member

DfE will carry out a risk assessment and identify next steps.

Ensure child/staff member isolates at home for 10 days from symptom onset.

Their household must isolate for 14 days. This includes live-in siblings.

'Bubble' of children/staff and 'close contacts'\* must self isolate for 14 days.

\* Close contacts are: Having been in 2 metre contact for 15 minutes or longer, or had face-to-face contact for 1 min or longer with the person.

Households with 'close contacts' do not need to self-isolate <u>unless</u> the 'close contact' experiences symptoms themselves. Please refer to government guidance <u>here</u>.
