Attendance and punctuality

Parents are reminded that all children are expected to be in every day at 8.00 am unless there is a valid reason for an authorized absence, parents must call the school office and inform reason of absence. Children who are going to be in late must call in to inform the school office before 8.00am. Punctualitymust be at a minimum of 97% this means a child cannot be late more than twice in a term! If attendance and punctuality fall below 96% a review will be conducted.

We will operate a strict policy for regular latecomers to encourage punctuality.

School Uniform
