
As a result of the above commitment, parents were invited to a workshop on safeguarding where they familiarised themselves with different types of abuse, internet safety, and how to safeguard their children. I believe it was a success for our school community and hopefully informed.



For Schools

Bianca from London Fire Brigade Education Department visited our school on the 16th of November 2022. She had sessions with year 2, Year 5 and 6. A In Year 2 children learned that fire is dangerous, and can hurt people., about common fire hazards, and to never play with matches and lighters. She also talked about smoke alarms and how they keep homes safe from fire.

The session with Year 5 and 6 was more detailed. She explained to the children that fire kills, destroys homes and spreads quickly. She told them that smoke can be as dangerous as fire, how smoke alarms work, and how to make sure they are working properly. Children discussed about how to make fire escape plans from homes (including tower blocks), what to do if there is a fire, and how to call 999. Please have further discussions with your children in the event of fire break out.



CLASS TRIPS

Year 5 and 6 Trip Gunnersbury Museum



Year 5 and 6 pupils visited Gunnersbury Park Museum for their topic of Victorian Britain. Children were given an explanation of how Victorian Schools functioned: Strict teachers; standing up until told to sit down; standing up when a teacher enters the room; personal hygiene; and learned how to ask questions and to be seen but not heard. They pupils enjoined the experience.

Year 3 and 4 Trip Alexander Palace





Year 1 and 2 Trip Science Museum






