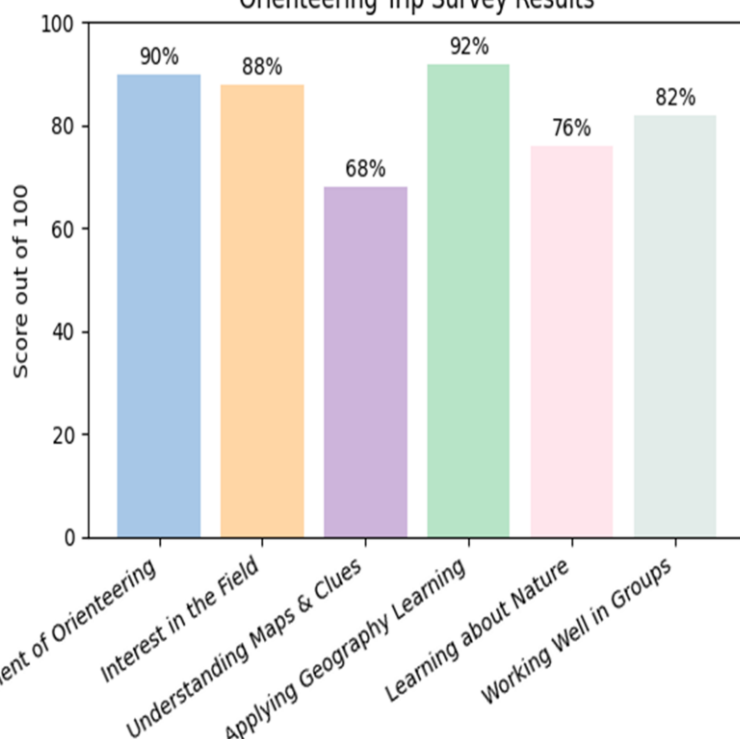
### A Message from The Headteacher

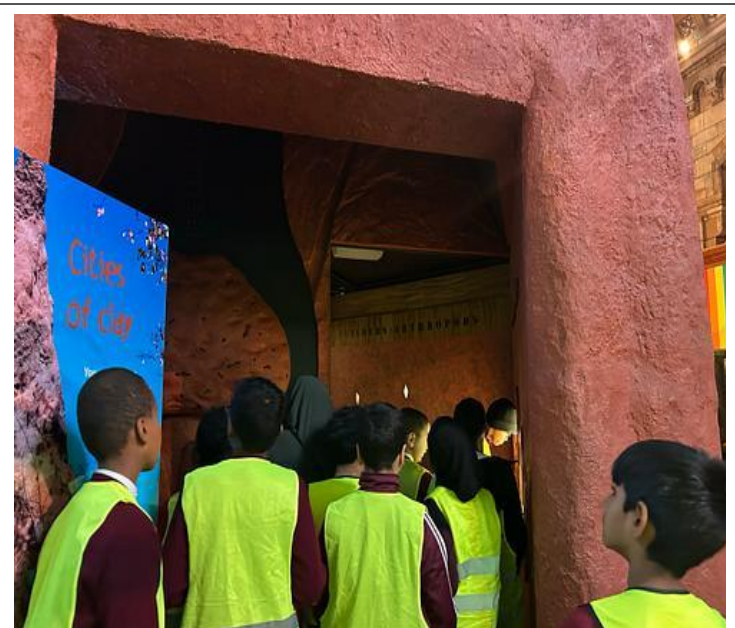




## Our School Trips

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This term, Pupils across the school took part in a range of enrichment trips and activities that enhanced learning beyond the classroom. Reception pupils explored the local area, developing their understanding of the world around them and practising key life skills such as observation and road safety. Year 1 and Year 2 enjoyed a sensory trip to the Science Museum, where hands-on exhibits supported curiosity and early scientific understanding. As part of the *Amazing Africa* topic, Year 3 and Year 4 pupils engaged in community fundraising by visiting the local mosque and by writing letters to an orphanage in Africa, promoting empathy, global awareness, and purposeful writing. Year 5 and Year 6 visited the History Museum, deepening their understanding of the past through real artefacts and exhibits. All trips were well organised, linked closely to the curriculum, and provided valuable opportunities for pupils to develop academically, socially, and culturally.

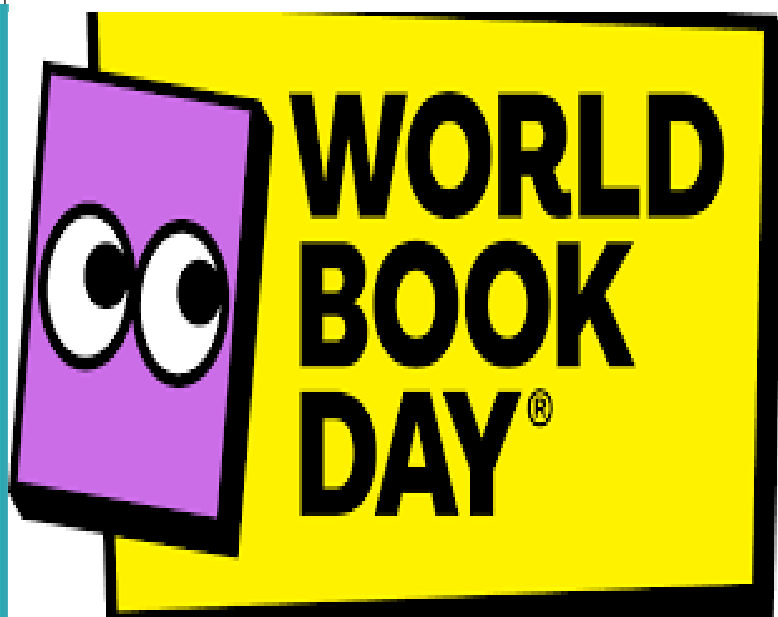
